

CMYBL 2009-10
General Game Rules Sheet

Ball Size	B4, B5, and All girls divisions use Women's Collegiate Size 28.5 Ball. B6, B7, B8 boys divisions use Men's regulation size basketball.
Game Length	B4,G4 - Two 13 Minute Stop Clock Halves B5,B6,G5,G6 - Two 14 Minute Stop Clock Halves B7,B8,G7,G8 - Two 15 Minute Stop Clock Halves
Half Time	5 Minutes
Overtime	3 Min. each, until tie is broken or teams agree to halt.
Time Outs	4, per regulation game. 1, per each overtime. Timeouts DO accumulate!
Clock Operator	HOST site MUST supply clock operator for ALL games played at host site.
Scorekeepers	Each team MUST provide their own scorebook and scorebook keeper for their game. Scorebook keepers for both teams must sit together at the same table with the clock operator. (During the game, scorekeepers must talk to each other to confer on baskets and fouls; check each other's books at half time!). Officials will designate official scorer before game begins.
Player Fouls	Player disqualified on 5th personal foul.
Bonus Free Throws	Players shoot 1 and 1 on 7th team foul per half. 2 free throws on 10 th team foul per half.
Free Throw "Violation" Line	Applies to games involving B4/G4/B5/G5/G6 grade teams. Host site is responsible for placing a 1 foot strip of "white athletic tape" on floor 13 ½ ft from basket; about 1 ½ feet in front of regulation free throw line). All free throw attempts must begin from behind the regulation 15 ft. line however, the player will be allowed to carry forward on the attempted free throw, BUT cannot violate the white tape line before the ball hits the rim. All other divisions B6/B7/B8/G7/G8 use the regulation 15 ft. free throw line and no carry forward is allowed.
Jerseys and Numbers	Infractions are not enforced. However, teams must wear distinctive colors in order for officials to determine players on each team. Outfitting your team with reversible jerseys eliminates this problem! If officials determine team colors are too similar, then the home team/host site is responsible for correcting the situation. Numbers on both the front and back of jerseys enables officials and scorekeepers to identify players much easier during game flow.
All Rules Not Listed	Should be followed / enforced in accordance with the current Year's High School Federation Rules Book.
